Asteroids related to: "Beatles":

1: BEATLES, 15 ARI 26, Speed=0°25', (#8749)

was named for British popular rock group during the latter half of 20th c and beyond, comprising John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison, Ringo Starr; separate asteroids were named for each, see Harrison, Lennon, McCartney and Starr

was discovered 3 Apr 1998 by J Broughton, Reedy Creek Obs and named in 2001

2: HARRISON, 6 ARI 03, Speed=0°15', (#4149)

was named for musician and environmentally concerned Beatle George Harrison

was discovered 9 Mar 1984 by B A Skiff, AM

People: actor Harrison Ford, US Presidents William Henry Harrison and Benjamin Harrison

Places: cape in NF; bay in AK; city in AR, GA, ID, MI, NE, NJ, NY, OH, TN; county in OH; Harrisonburg city in LA, VA; Harrisonville city in MO

Harrison Sxt Sat 0°54' S

3: LENNON, 7 GEM 10, Speed=0°26', (#4147)

was named for musician and Beatles member, peace activist, John Lennon. See other Beatles member asteroids McCartney, Harrison, and Starr. Asteroid Lennon conjoined asteroid Tokio, Mars and Venus in summer 1968 when John Lennon met Tokyo-born Yoko Ono

was discovered 12 Jan 1983 by B A Skiff, AM

4: LINDA, 12 PIS 38, Speed=0°22', (#7169)

was named for 20th century photographer, member of the musical group Wings, author of vegetarian cookbooks, wife and inspiration to Beatle Paul McCartney, Linda McCartney, friend to the environment, animals, and all humanity. *Linda is Spanish for pretty, Susan is a Hebrew word for lily

was discovered 4 Oct 1986 by E Bowell at Anderson Mesa Station of Lowell Observatory and named in 1998

5: MCCARTNEY, 23 LIB 32, Speed=0°09', (#4148)

was named for composer and musician ex-Beatle Paul McCartney

was discovered 11 Jul 1983 by EB, AM

6: STARR, 12 CAN 05, Speed=0°26', (#4150)

was named for drummer for The Beatles Ringo Starr, pseudonym for Richard Starkey

was discovered 31 Aug 1984 by B A Skiff, AM
